As we embark on another exciting Rotary month, I invite you to explore the captivating content of this month's bulletin.



t the 2023 Rotary International Convention in Melbourne, I asked all Rotary members to become champions in our effort to illuminate mental health needs near and far. This includes helping one another feel more supported, advocating for mental health services, and building bridges with experts in the field to expand access to treatment.

It's an important task and a big ask. But it's also something that should feel familiar to every Rotary member — because everything we do is in the spirit of caring, giving, friendship, and compassion, and has been from the beginning of our organization.

We've grown into an amazing global network of 1.4 million interconnected community leaders — leaders who share a deep commitment to doing good in the world. But what makes Rotary powerful isn't just what we do for the communities we serve. We also support and empower each other, by creating a

safe space for our members to bring their whole, authentic selves. We show each other comfort and

These connections are deeply meaningful. The surgeon general recently declared loneliness a public health epidemic. Dr. Vivek Murthy said, "We must prioritize building social connection the same way we have prioritized other critical public health issues such as tobacco, obesity, and substance use disorders." I am proud of what Rotary has done across generations to build those kinds of social connections — and this magazine focused on loneliness and what Rotary can do about it in its January 2023 issue.

Our worldwide community and our foundational value prioritizing Service Above Self makes Rotary a powerful global advocate for mental health. A recently published study by Ohio State University found performing acts of kindness was the only one of three mental health interventions tested that helped people feel more connected to others. Study co-author David Cregg said, "Performing acts of kindness seems to be one of the best ways to promote those connections."

This research suggests what we've known all along — that doing good helps transform not just the communities we serve, but it also transforms us. As we put a greater focus on mental health, let's not think of this effort as something new to Rotary, but rather as something we can do better and as a result have a greater impact on ourselves and the people we serve.

We are not starting this effort from scratch. The Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives has been focused on these kinds of issues for several years, and we will be looking to members of that group for leadership as we continue to build awareness.

Mental health care fits comfortably within several of our areas of focus. As of May, there are 41 global grant-supported projects with a mental health focus. Many of them have tremendous promise, and we will be highlighting them in the months ahead.

So, let's work together to erase the stigma associated with emotional well-being, raise awareness of mental health needs, and improve access to preventive and interventional mental health services.

Together, we will Create Hope in the World.

Embracing Hope for Salama School for the Blind

In the quiet town of Mukono, just 25 kilometers away from Uganda's bustling capital city, Kampala, lies Salama School for the Blind. This humble institution has been a beacon of light for visually impaired children and young adults since its establishment in April 1999. However, tragedy struck the school when a devastating fire broke out in its dormitory on Oct. 25, 2022 leaving the entire community reeling from grief and despair. But amidst the darkness, a glimmer of hope emerged as the Rotaract club of Bwebajja, in collaboration with Indo Africa, Nytil, and the Rotary club of Bwebajja, united to make a lasting impact on the lives of these brave students.

When news of the fire at Salama

School reached the ears of the Rotaract Club of Bwebajja, it sparked an unyielding desire to extend a helping hand. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, they swiftly joined forces with their partners to initiate a support project that would touch the lives of these young souls.

On a warm and hopeful day, the project came to fruition, as the team arrived at Salama School with hearts full of empathy and determination. Generous donations from supporters near and far enabled the provision of essential supplies: warm blankets, comfortable mattresses, soft bedsheets, and clothing. The joy on the faces of the students, as they received these simple yet invaluable items, was indescribable.

Beyond the physical provisions, the project sought to heal emotional wounds and reignite hope. The team organized engaging activities and spent quality time with the students, reminding them that they are valued and cherished. As smiles gradually replaced tear-stained faces, it became evident that the project had left an indelible mark on their hearts.

A tree planting initiative became the symbol of growth and resilience. Together, they nurtured young saplings and gently placed them in the earth, as if sowing the seeds of a

brighter future. Each tree represented a life reclaimed, a spirit revived, and a commitment to environmental stewardship. The students, with their heightened senses, appreciated the significance of this act, knowing that they too were part of a thriving ecosystem.

The impact of the Rotaract Club's project extended far beyond the school's boundaries. It sparked a sense of solidarity within the community, uniting people from diverse backgrounds under a common cause. Strangers became friends, and supporters became advocates, amplifying the message of hope and inclusivity.

As the sun set on the day of the project, leaving behind a sky adorned with hues of orange and pink, a transformation had taken place at Salama School for the Blind. The tragedy that once cast a shadow over the institution was now eclipsed by the resilience and compassion of those who rallied to its aid.


will endure.

SPINA BIFIDA

The recommended dose of Folic acid is usually 400 to 800 mcg for planning women conceive or during early pregnancy. of weeks However, women with certain risk factors like previous history of babies with neural tube defects or diabetes may need to consult a health care provider to determine an appropriate dosage for them.

THE CRUCIAL ROLE OF FOLIC ACID IN EARLY PREGNANCY



Folic acid also known as vitamin B9 is a vital nutrient that the body can't produce on its own thus must be obtained through supplements or dietary sources like leafy green vegetables, citrus fruits, legumes and liver.

However, due to its significance during early weeks of pregnancy, supplementation of Folic acid to ensure adequate intake is recommended.

Taking Folic acid during early pregnancy is a simple yet powerful step that can significantly impact the wellbeing of both mother and growing foetus in the following ways;

Preventing Anaemia

Folic acid aids in the production and maturation of red blood cells, helping prevent anaemia and ensuring adequate oxygen supply to both the cells of the foetus and mother.

Cell division and DNA synthesis.

Folic acid is essential for cell division and DNA synthesis, which are fundamental processes required for rapid fetal growth and development.

Proper cell division ensures the formation of tissues and organs, contributing to the overall health of the baby.

Prevention of neural tube defects at birth.

One of the most critical functions of Folic acid is its role in the early development of the neural tube in a foetus. The neural tube eventually develops into the baby's brain and spinal cord.

Major birth defects of the brain or spine occur very early in pregnancy (3 to 4 weeks after conception), before most women know they are pregnant hence the need to take Folic acid one month before conception if a woman is planning to get pregnant.

Consuming sufficient Folic acid during the first weeks of pregnancy drastically reduces the risk of neural tube defects such as spina bifida and anencephaly, where parts of the brain or spinal cord do not develop properly
